

- > According to our recently conducted survey at Kamathipura across the 14

lanes, due to inactive ICDS centres, more than 50 per cent of the boys between the ages of 2.5-5 are not going to any school/balwadi. Therefore, AAWC has started taking these boys under the Umang program so that they have access to pre-primary and value education.

Boarding Home Follow-Up Visit:


Mothers were taken to the SOS boarding home to meet their children. However, visits to other boarding homes were made at random.

UMEED Update

- > The Andhashraddha Nirmulan workshop was organised in order to clear superstitions and misconceptions, and to create awareness among women who fall prey to quacks and fake local doctors.
- > An eye check-up camp was conducted by the K B Bacchuali hospital for the women. Twenty-seven women got spectacles whereas three women were diagnosed with cataract.
- > The workshop on Immoral Trafficking and Prevention Act was conducted by Ms Manju Vyas (Director) to disseminate knowledge and create awareness about problems and legal measures to prevent immoral human trafficking and

- to protect the rights of victims being trafficked.
- > We have started following kits designed by the Janshikshan Sansthan


(the scheme of government of India) for our adult literacy campaign, to educate and empower the women in Kamathipura.
